ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

The Fraser Stryker Diversity Scholarship provides financial aid for college-bound students in the Omaha metro area who are interested in pursuing a career in law and have a financial need. Scholarship recipients will also be given the opportunity to work a paid internship at Fraser Stryker during the summer to further their knowledge in the legal field.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

The \$2,500 Fraser Stryker Diversity scholarship is to be used by recipients solely for his or her tuition, fees, books, and supplies needed to further their college education. Scholarship recipients are awarded \$2,500 per academic school year. The scholarship is subject to yearly renewal at the discretion of the Fraser Stryker Diversity Scholarship Committee, with a minimum of a cumulative 3.0 GPA and 12 credit hours per semester required for consideration.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Fraser Stryker Diversity Scholarship, students must meet the minimum following requirements at the time of application:

- High school seniors of diverse origins
- Attend public or private high school in the greater Omaha area
- Accepted to an accredited college or university located in the United States
- Interested in pursuing a career in law
- Ability to demonstrate a financial need
- Top 20% class rank
- Residency in the Omaha area for the previous four consecutive years
