ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

The Fraser Stryker Diversity Scholarship provides financial aid to diverse college-bound students in the Omaha metro area who are interested in pursuing a career in law and have a financial need. Scholarship recipients will have the opportunity to work a paid internship at Fraser Stryker during the summer to further their knowledge in the legal field.

SCHOLARSHIP DETAILS

The Fraser Stryker Diversity Scholarship recipients are awarded \$2,500 per academic school year. The scholarship is to be used for tuition, fees, books, and supplies needed for the recipient's college education. Scholarships are subject to yearly renewal at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee, with a minimum of a cumulative 3.0 GPA and 12 credit hours per semester required.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

To be eligible for the Fraser Stryker Diversity Scholarship, applicants must meet the following minimum requirements at the time he or she applies:

- High school seniors of diverse origins
- Attend public or private high school in the greater Omaha metro area
- Accepted to an accredited college or university located in the United States
- Interested in pursuing a career in law
- Ability to demonstrate a financial need
- Top 20% class rank
- Residency in the Omaha area for the previous four consecutive years
